Worthy Sir Knights,

September is upon us and here is our second Newsletter of the Fraternal Year. As Summer comes to an end with the celebration of Labor Day in honor of the social and economic achievements of American working men and women. It was established as a federal holiday in 1894 brought about by the labor movement of the late 19th century. At that time 12-hour days and children as young as 5 and 6 worked in mills factories and mines earning a fraction of their adult counter parts. Working conditions were very harsh for everyone without access to fresh air, sanitary facilities and breaks. Labor Unions came to be and strikes and protests happened often with violent outcomes. After a long struggle working men and women gained more favorable working conditions and the "Working Mans Holiday" came into being with the establishment of Labor Day. Now we celebrate it as an end of summer with cookouts and a long weekend owing it to the struggles of working men and women who strived for better working conditions for all.

These were also the times of Fr. McGivney, who saw the struggles of workers and formed the Knights of Columbus in 1882 to provide financial assistance in the event of a working man's death to their widows and orphans and a fraternal organization of men helping one another. Although he died in 1890 at age 38, he saw firsthand the struggles of working men and woman in that age leading up to the changes that took place and made a difference in his time. This month we remember the infamous date of September 11, 2001 just as Pearl Harbor December 7, 1941 dates that live in infamy. This year being the 20th anniversary of 9-11 PBOC will be having a Blue Mass Saturday, September 11 at 5:00 pm with the participation of local Police and Fire first responders with a Mass honoring all first responders and those who lost lives that day. There will be a wreath laying ceremony with the Knights of Columbus Honor Guard and Color Guard presenting the colors. The Knights of Columbus will also be at the Georgetown Bridges for a ceremony earlier in the day to honor those who lost their lives on 9-11 and honor all the first responders who gave tirelessly on that day and many days after. Many are still struggling with the aftermaths of 9-11 with health and emotional issues and we must offer prayers for them all. We also welcome the beginning of football season with the start of fall and a change in the weather. Trips to the mountains to see the fall colors will start along with visits to apple orchards and farmers markets for the fall harvest.

We will have a busy month in October with the Pasta Dinner October 9 with signup sheets on the website if you would like to help out. I already have many volunteers and I thank all of you.

In closing I want to pray to all the Holy Angels and Saints and Mother Mary through Jesus Christ for your health and wellbeing in September.

Council 3067 Report

Council 3067 just filed with Supreme today our 5th Food Pantry Report for 2021, totaling 6,350 pounds of food donated to "Helping Hands of Georgetown" and St. Cyprian Outreach; resulting in \$500 of rebate funds from Supreme to our Charity Account!

Council 3067 has raised over \$6300 to date in 2021 from 2 Columbus Hope drives; with 3rd drive scheduled for September 10 - 11, 2021 at Walmart; and 4th and final drive scheduled for October 29 - 30, 2021. Due to COVID restraints in 2021, State K of C reportedly has revised our small council goal "down" from approximately \$4400; but our Council-set goal remains \$10,000! Funds will be evenly split between Special Olympics - Area 9, the J.O.Y. School of Pawleys Island and the Georgetown County Board of Disabilities and Special Needs.
