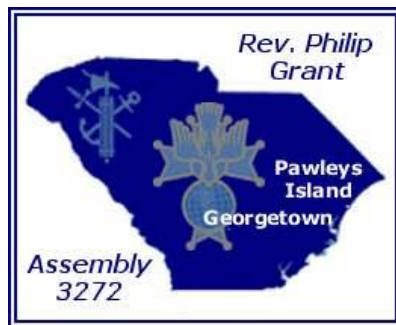

## Assembly 3272 Newsletter

Worthy Sir Knights,

October is upon us and here is our third Newsletter of the Fraternal Year. Fall is here which means Oyster and Clam season are open as of October 1, 2021.

October 1, we honor St. Therese of the Child Jesus. Generations of Catholics have admired her the "Little Flower" in her short life of much inspiration. Yet, Therese died when she was 24, after having lived as cloistered Carmelite for less than ten years. She never went on missions, never founded a religious order, never performed great works. The only book of hers, published after her death, was a brief edited version of her journal called "Story of a Soul." But within 28 years of her death, the public demand was so great that she was canonized and is a Doctor of the Church.

October 2 is the Feast of the Guardian Angels and it is celebrated annually. Paul V was the first Pope, in 1608, to authorize a feast day in honor of Guardian Angels. Pope Clement X changed the date to October 2 and Leo XIII, in 1883, upgraded the date to a double major feast. These angelic beings are around us always and need your acknowledgement and prayers. They will reveal themselves if you ask.

Today many of us were in Georgetown for the annual "Life Chain". It was good to see many parishioners who attended. Many motorists showed support by honking horns and waiving.

In 2020 the Vatican announced that October 5 will be made as the Feast Day of St. Faustina Kowalska the Patron Saint of Mercy and was entered into the General Roman Calendar. This means 2020 was the first time it was celebrated all around the world and made a permanent Feast honoring St. Faustina on October 5.

The month of October is also dedicated to the Holy Rosary. The Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on October 7. This year the sixth annual "Rosary Coast to Coast" event and is scheduled for Sunday, October 10 at 4:00 pm. There are 2 locations again this year. The rosary will be prayed in the church at PBOC, and at

Litchfield Inn. A tent will be setup on the beach with programs and volunteers to guide you.

We have our Pasta Dinner on Saturday, October 9 starting at 5:00 pm at both the Precious Blood PLC and at St. Mary's Hall in Georgetown from 5:00 to 7:30 pm. If you have not yet sent in for your tickets, please do so by October 6. We will offer both dine-in and carry-out. Kids under 5 eat free and tickets will be available at the door. The Chalice program will benefit all Sir Knights at some point so please help us with this worthy cause.

October 15, we honor St. Teresa of Avila also a Doctor of the Church. She had many mystical experiences and her writings are also well known.

Our friends at the PBOC Women's Club are having the Big Arts and Crafts Fair on Friday, October 22 and Saturday, October 23 at the PLC. Please support them with this great event. It has been very successful and grown over the years.

On the 28 of October, we honor St. Simon and St. Jude, Apostles of Christ. St. Jude is the saint of hopeless cases and helped Danny Thomas the famous TV star out of his depression. In honor, the St. Jude Hospital for Children was envisioned and came into being with the philanthropy of Danny Thomas.

October 31 is, of course, Halloween or All Hallows Eve and leads us into November with All Saints and All Souls.

Pickup or delivery of fresh wreaths will be begun right after Thanksgiving. We will be supporting Veterans causes with this fundraiser so please support us and buy a wreath or two.
