November 2021 Assembly 3272 Newsletter

Worthy Sir Knights,

November is upon us and here is our fourth Newsletter of the Fraternal Year. The month of November is the month of remembrance and is traditionally dedicated to the holy souls in Purgatory. It begins with All Hallows Eve or Halloween the last day of October. Then on November 1 we celebrate All Saints Day, not a holy day of obligation this year. We honor all the Saints known and unknown.

All Saints' Day was formally started by Pope Boniface IV, who consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the Virgin Mary and all the Martyrs on May 13 in 609 AD. Boniface IV also established All Souls' Day, which follows All Saints on November 2. All Souls Day or the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed marked by the sign of faith. All Souls is not a Holy Day of Obligation but it is a very important part of our ancient Catholic tradition. St. Odilo in 998 A.D. established November 2nd as the date on which the monks at his monastery at Cluny would hold commemorations for their deceased members, and this date eventually won acceptance as the date for All Souls in the Universal Church. It is our Catholic tradition to pray for the deceased.

Also, of note this year, the Vatican recently announced on October 28 to grant a plenary indulgence to Catholics who visit a cemetery to pray for the dead on any day in the whole month of November. Usually, the Church only grants this plenary indulgence for the souls in Purgatory to those who pray in a cemetery on Nov. 1-8, the week of the Solemnity of All Souls' Day.

This includes the particular Nov. 2 plenary indulgence one can receive for one's own soul by visiting a church or an oratory and reciting an Our Father and the Creed which can now also be done any day in November.

A plenary indulgence remits all temporal punishment due to sin. It must always be accompanied by a full detachment from sin. A Catholic who wishes to obtain a plenary indulgence must also fulfill the ordinary conditions of an indulgence, which are sacramental confession, receive the Eucharist, and pray for the Pope's intentions. Sacramental confession and receiving the Eucharist can occur up to about 20 days before or after the indulgenced act. On November 11, we honor our Veterans and Assembly 3272 Honor Guard will take part and march in the Georgetown parade starting at 2:00 pm to honor our Veterans. Originally known as Armistice Day November 11 1919 the first anniversary of the end of World War 1 on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. Then in 1954 Congress changed it to Veterans Day and it is a federal holiday always observed on November 11 to honor Veterans who have served in the Armed Forces.

On November 16, at 8:30 am the Women' Club will have a special Mass to honor all deceased members of the Women's Club.

On November 18, at 6:00 pm we will have our memorial mass to honor our deceased Knights of Columbus.

On November 21 is the Feast of Christ the King, which was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925, to remind Catholics and the world that Jesus Christ is Lord of the Universe, both as God and as Man. It is the last Sunday in ordinary time.

On November 25th we celebrate Thanksgiving. This tradition goes back to September 8, 1565 in St Augustine FL. the Native Americans and Spanish settlers held a feast and the Holy Mass was offered. A second similar Thanksgiving celebration occurred on April 30, 1598 in Texas when Don Juan de Onate declared a day of Thanksgiving that would be commemorated by the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Our current tradition of Thanksgiving we can trace back to a Native American named Squanto who mediated between the Puritan Pilgrims and the Native Americans. Squanto had been enslaved by the English but was freed by Spanish Franciscans. Squanto received Baptism and became a Catholic. So, it was Squanto a Baptized Catholic who orchestrated what became known today as Thanksgiving.

November 28, we celebrate the first Sunday of Advent and light the first candle in our Advent wreath to prepare for the coming of Christ. In the month of November, we honor many Saints and events almost every day but most important it is the month of Remembrance for all the faithful departed and the souls in Purgatory.

As Catholics we pray for the dead and we believe in life after death. When Christ was talking with Martha about the passing of Lazarus her brother, he proclaimed "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die" By this alone we can be sure there is life beyond this earthly realm.

Einstein said as we know through thermodynamics, energy cannot be created or destroyed. It simply changes states from one form to another. Therefore, your light that is, the essence of your energy, your soul, not to be confused with your consciousness will continue until the end of time and beyond. As in the Nicene Creed we pray "God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made" and all that is, "visible and invisible". So, we can take comfort in this knowing we will be transformed and be like Christ, so the dead live and can help us on our earthly journey to Heaven.

In closing, we are currently running our Advent Fundraiser. Selling Advent wreaths and Advent Calendars along with live evergreen wreaths and garland. Please support our efforts for Veterans and go to our website www.kofc3272.org. and click the banner at the top for wreaths or the separate order form for Advent wreaths and Advent calendars.

You can order live evergreen wreaths directly online for pickup at the Church December 4 and 5 or have the items shipped directly to you with added shipping cost. Orders must be placed by November 8 for pickup and November 11, for direct delivery. We will be supporting Veterans causes with this fundraiser so please support us and buy a wreath or two. May God Bless all of you and keep you safe without fear.

The Assembly also ran an ad in the Coastal Observer. November 8 is the cutoff for pick up at PBOC on December 4 & 5. November 11 is the cutoff to have them shipped to your home.

Thanksgiving meals that are cooked in Georgetown will be done again this year. PBOC usually helps out with yams.

Veterans Day this year will happen with a parade in Georgetown. We will muster in Georgetown at 1:00 pm and parade at 2:00 pm. The Santa Maria will be in the parade.

Similarly they have re-opened to PI Council 11028, toward their 2021 drive!

Council 3067 has approved going ahead with our 36th Annual Thanksgiving for Those In Need Program for this Thanksgiving! Council will continue to work with and count on the St. Mary's facilities, donations from St. Vincent DePaul Society from St. Michael's, Council 11028 from PI, and personal donations to help fund this wonderful program. The plan is to feed around 400 complete meals again this year in the Georgetown County community on Thanksgiving Day!

Council approved to donate \$100 to Birthright of Georgetown in memoriam of Bennett Trey Howard, 9-day old baby of Sir Knight Brian Howard (Ashli); and \$100 to Bishop Guglielmone's new "I Give Catholic" Campaign. Council also approved to expand our monthly Food Pantry Program to include a special participation to supply canned and dry good items to 50 of 100 Christmas Food Boxes being distributed into the community by St. Cyprian Outreach. 2021 to date, Council has donated 7,043 total pounds of canned and dried goods St. Cyprian Outreach and Georgetown Helping Hands.

Council 3067 continues to meet on the 2nd Thursday of each month at 6 pm at the Maryville Social Hall in the Maryville Community of Georgetown.
