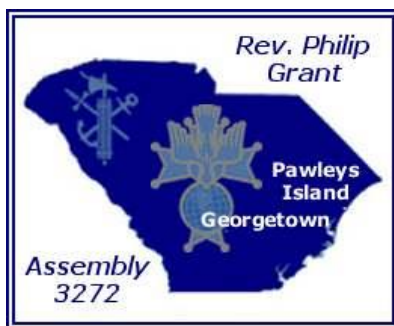

We have three events April 22, 23, 24 – the Memorial Mass for Phil Brice, PBOC, 11:00 AM; the Exemplification; and the Divine Mercy Sunday. Mathematically we should be able to handle them considering we have 13 fully uniformed Sir Knights on my list of

Honor Guard Members. Realistically we average about 6 per event, which isn't bad considering most of the Strand Honor Guards only have about 6 fully uniformed members. If you have been participating in our events and have been making that extra effort to make them, I thank you and am honored to serve with you. If your schedule is such that you are unable to participate, I understand. I hope that with the variety we have scheduled you might be able to occasionally join us and experience what I find to be truer during each of our events: It is an Honor to be in the Honor Guard.

I want to thank the 10 Sir Knights who joined me under very short notice for the Funeral Mass of Brother James Barnett. Those Worthy Sir Knights included: Jim McMahon, Roger Brouillette, Ed Gagliano, Bill Sturgeon, Dan Roberts, Joe Gabriel, Emile Martineau, Bob O'Rourke, Bob Hilken, and Colin Peterson. It was a rather large affair with a celebration of life before the standard funeral mass. Of course with James Barnett being Irish the services had a distinct Irish Flavor including Bagpipers leading the procession to the Columbarium. We missed the festivities in Charleston, but in a sense had our own St. Patrick's Day Parade.

Eight Sir Knights joined me in participating in the Mass for the Day of the Unborn Child, which was sponsored by the Knights of Columbus Council 11028. They included: Roger Brouillette, Bob Frappier, Dan Roberts, Colin Peterson, Bob Hilken, Bob O'Rourke, Len Vercellotti, and Brian Reid. This was a great turnout for a great cause. Life is of course the first of the unalienable rights listed in the Declaration of Independence. On March 28, 2017, President Donald Trump signed the Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act of 2017. This act officially recognizes March 29 as National Vietnam War Veterans Day. The act also includes the day among those days the US Flag should especially be displayed. The Georgetown VFW put together a program in commemoration and asked our Color Guard to be a part of it. Initially our response was weak. It appeared we might have six Sir Knights.

These are all experienced Sir Knights, and we pulled it off without a hitch. The ceremony was well planned. Brief but to the point. It will probably become an annual affair.
